Amos warns us and welcomes us: God <u>roars</u>. (1:1-2)

**Amos Basics** (1:1, 7:14-15):

- Amos means "burden-bearer."
- Amos was the first of the "writing" prophets and wrote approximately 760 B.C.
- Amos was a sheepherder, cattleman and sycamore-fig farmer from Judah called to address the issues of injustice in the prosperous northern kingdom.

God is certainly <u>paying attention</u>. (1-6; 3:4)

God will certainly deal with injustice.

(3:8; 4:1-2, 12-13; 7-9)

God has certain expectations for his people:

(3:1-2; Genesis 12:3)

- We will <u>care</u> for others. (5:4, 14, 24)
- We will be <u>cared for</u>.

(Amos 8:9-12; 9:11-15; Matthew 26:53-54)
