- He dialogues with God about the circumstances and situation of his Day. This is what makes him different from the other prophets.

Habakkuks's Dialogue with God

H | "God, do you even care?" (1:1-4)

G | "Yes, I care. I am working!" (1:5-11)

H | "I am not okay with that, but I'll wait." (1:11-2:1)

G | "Judgement will happen!" (2:2-2:20)

H | "Even if it's bleak, I will rejoice in the Lord!" (3:1-19)

We can be happy, when it seems like God is not working, because God <u>rescues</u> those who trust in him.

(Habakkuk 2:4; 3:17-19)
